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


## Happy New Year!

In partnership with the **Association for Mineral Exploration (AME)** and **Teck Resources Ltd.**, MineralsEd is happy to announce that we will be attending **AME Roundup 2022** in person! **AME Roundup** is the largest annual mining and mineral exploration conference in western Canada. This year, our programs will include **Teachers' Pro-D Day**, **Secondary Student Career Exploration Day**, and **Elementary Rockhounds**.



### Teachers' Pro-D Day (January 31)

MineralsEd invites teachers to join us on **Monday, January 31** for our **Teachers' Pro-D Day** program. This unique event provides B.C. teachers with an opportunity to become more familiar with the minerals industry, new technologies, and the enormous breadth of careers in this vital resource sector. The highlight of the program is a panel of industry guest speakers who will shed light on this year's theme of **Innovation and Technology**.

This year's guest speakers will present on *Earth X-Ray for Low Impact Mining*, *3D Mine Modeling and Virtual Reality*, *Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning*, and *Carbon Capture in Ultramafic Mine Tailings*. Lastly, our keynote speaker **Lana Eagle** will be speaking on *Truth and Reconciliation in the Mining and Mineral Exploration Industry*.

### **Virtual Junior Geologist Workshop**

In this 90-minute virtual workshop, **MineralsEd** Partner-Teachers will guide your students through activities that explore the world of rocks and minerals! Before the workshop, a package of rocks and mineral kits will be delivered to your classroom and each student will have their own set of materials for safe hands-on learning. Topics include the roles of minerals in everyday life, mineral resources in B.C., the rock cycle, and mineral identification. Students will also be able to practice making observations, predictions, and experiments - all part of the scientific process!

This workshop is perfect for intermediate grade classes learning about Earth Science, rocks and mineral resources, and mining.
